



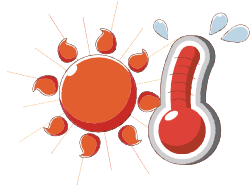

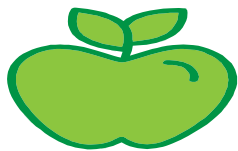

Dear friends,

Beginning in July and going through August and beyond, the Parish Forum (Sundays at 9:30 AM) will have a series called, The Seven Deadly Sins (and Their Corresponding Virtues). They are sometimes called capital sins. They are sins that cannot be classified in any other sin.

They are mentioned, though not exclusively in Proverbs and Galatians. The modern concept comes from a 4th century monk, Evarius Ponticus. They were translated from Greek to Latin by John Cassian. In 590, Pope Gregory I revised the list that we know today and was used by Dante in *The Divine Comedy*.

The seven deadly sins and their corresponding virtues are:

The main question we will explore as we study this series is not who has committed what, but rather, if and how these deadly sins are still relevant today. In his 1973 book, *Whatever Became of Sin?*, Karl Menninger argued that the traditional list of the seven deadly sins was incomplete; that most modern ethicists would include cruelty and dishonesty and probably would rate these as more serious than some of the more traditional sins such as gluttony or sadness.

The Enneagram of Personality integrates the seven with two additional "sins", *deceit* and *fear*. The Enneagram descriptions are broader than the traditional Christian interpretation and are presented in a comprehensive map.

All of this involves our tendency to catalog stuff, including our sins. Certainly, governments give value to sins by applying different punishments for various offenses.

Join us as we evaluate the deadly sins and talk about what's wrong with everyone else.

Treasurer's report: There were no significant losses this month. We are still behind

Sesquicentennial update: We are right on schedule for the celebration. There will be a donation box available throughout the three days.

Finance Committee Report: Two members of the finance committee and the Senior Warden met Bobbi Yeo from the Diocesan Response Team. She felt we had a lot going for us and should focus on increasing revenue. Suggestions included starting a school, renting space to non profits, or even allowing a cell

phone company to put a tower in our spire. She would like to introduce us to the diocesan endowment plan.
